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
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## National ID “Rehistro Bulilit” Campaign in Kabugao

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) successfully conducted the "Rehistro Bulilit" campaign, a nationwide initiative aimed at registering children from ages 0 to 4 for the National ID system. This special registration event took place at Poblacion, Kabugao, Apayao, and aimed to ensure that children in the area are included in the national database.

The mission of the event was clear: to register young children for the National ID, a vital step towards ensuring they have access to services and benefits from the government. Beyond the registration of children, the event also offered various other services to the attendees.

In addition to children's registration, the event offered several other important services. These included Step 2 registration for individuals already part of the National ID process, updating of demographic information for existing registrants, issuance of National IDs in paper form for those who completed their registration, assistance in generating Digital National IDs for online services, and birth registration assistance through the Birth Registration Assistance Project.

A total of 61 registrants were served during the event. Of these, 17 were children under the age of 5, directly benefiting from the Rehistro Bulilit initiative. The remaining 44 registrants were adults who completed their Step 2 registration and received other services.

In addition to these services, PSA personnel took the opportunity to distribute Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials to all attendees, educating the community about the importance of the National ID and other government services.
