The Philippine Statistics Authority in Apayao held a presentation of the 2024 Community-Based Monitoring System (2024 CBMS) preliminary results on July 17 and 31 in the Municipalities of Luna and Flora, respectively. The presentation focused on the initial generated tables aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) that will guide preparations for the official release and turnover of the final CBMS data.

A Mobile Civil Registry System (CRS) Outlet Services were conducted on July 8 to 23 in Calanasan, Pudtol and Santa Marcela with 1,386 documents issued. The work suspension in July 23 and 24 cut short the work schedule in Santa Marcela.

These sessions ensured that all participants gained adequate knowledge of both topics, promoting a uniform understanding and facilitating smooth operations during the data collection process.

A five-day Third Level Training on 2025 Updating of List of Agricultural Farm Operators and Listing of Inland Fishing Households was held at the PSA conference hall on July 29 up to August 1 to re-echo what was tackled in the Second Level Training led by the PSA Regional Office on July 22 to 25 in Baguio City. The levels of training is to capacitate those involved in this survey to begin on August 11.

Conduct of 2025 LFS FIES Visit 1

Data collection for the 2025 Labor Force Survey (LFS) and Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES) Visit 1 began on July 8, with 26 field personnel deployed across the province. A total of 809 households were successfully visited.

The LFS gathers key labor market data, such as employment rates, hours worked, and jobseeker profiles. Meanwhile, the FIES, conducted in two rounds (July 2025 and January 2026), serves as the main source of data on family income, spending, and living standards—essential for analyzing income distribution and economic inequality in the country.
