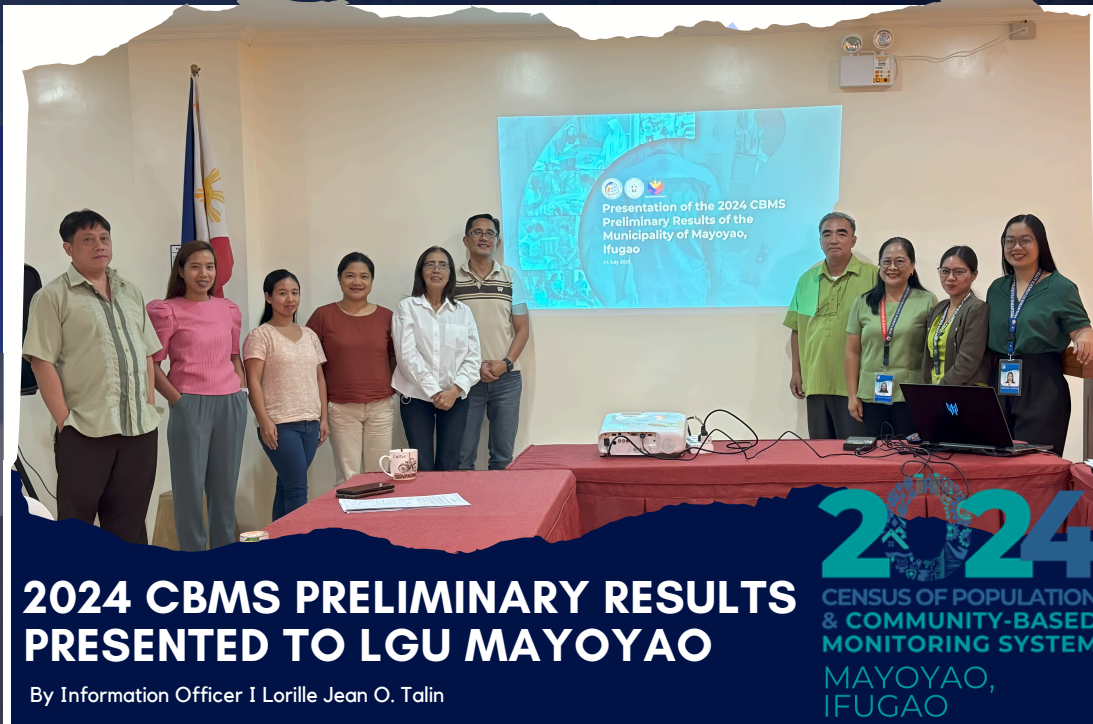

2024 CBMS PRELIMINARY RESULTS PRESENTED TO LGU MAYOYAO

The Philippine Statistics Authority - Ifugao Provincial Statistical Office conducted the first presentation of the 2024 Community Based Monitoring System (CBMS) Preliminary Results for the Municipality of Mayoyao on 29 July 2025 at the PSA Conference Hall, Lagawe, Ifugao. Five participants from the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Mayoyao attended the activity, particularly those involved in poverty alleviation planning and program implementation. These included MPDC Florence Ponchinlan, ADAS II Fely Bay-ong, and PDA II Elizabeth Bongallon from the Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO); Accountant Peter G. Lahina, Jr. from the Accounting Office; and Karen L. Buccahan from the Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO).

Chief Statistical Specialist Delano C. Bolisli, Jr. rendered a welcome and opening remarks. He urged participants to actively participate and share their insights and observations. Senior Statistical Specialist Bernadette B. Guledew presented the key highlights of the 2024 CBMS preliminary results which covers various indicators aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals.

The session was further enriched by the presentation of Philippine Standard Industrial Classification (PSIC) and Philippine Standard Geographic Classification (PSGC) by COSW-Statistical Analyst Syrene Mae T. Butticon. Also presented is the PSA-LGU Data Sharing on Business Registers Project of Mayoyao by COSW-Statistical Analyst Junelyne D. Carabacan.

During the open forum, PSO - Ifugao addressed the LGU's data concerns and expressed confidence that these would be resolved before the final turnover. The CBMS results will be crucial in formulating inclusive and evidence-based policies for Mayoyao.

... To maintain and verify quality standards regarding the ongoing data collection, Osvaldo P. Cofolan, Statistical Specialist II of PSA RSSO - CAR, conducted field supervision in selected sample areas of Ifugao. On July 17, 2025, he first visited Tam-an, Banaue to evaluate the work progress of Statistical Researcher Rochelle Cabbigat, who was supported by Team Supervisor Grail Marie Oybon. Later that day, he went to Lucban, Lamut to supervise the activities of Statistical Researcher Elaine Ligaya Aydinan with Team Supervisor Shyra Jevie Bulayo. On July 18, together with PSO - Ifugao Supervising Statistical Specialist Jocelyn O. Tayaban they proceeded to Munggayang, Kiangnan to monitor the activities of Kayle Ann Gumayon, a Statistical Researcher, along with her Team Supervisor, Beviame Maimban. These visits, which are part of routine monitoring processes, were designed to ensure that field protocols are adhered to and to provide direct support advice to the field personnel.

National ID Drive Hits Magulon

PSO - Ifugao, working hand in hand with the DSWD - FOCAR, ran a four-day mobile registration on the selected Barangay of Lamut, Ifugao on 22-25 July 2025.

Based on the records provided by the Department of Social Welfare and Development, Field Office Cordillera Administrative Region (DSWD-FOCAR), there are 1,688 Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) variances in the municipality of Lamut, Ifugao, who will be targeted for National ID registration, along with the beneficiaries of AKAP, AICS, and SOCPEN.

There were 17 clients successfully registered by RKO Jovie Lumawig on the first day and 12 were DSWD beneficiaries. Twenty-one individuals were also accommodated for the retrieval of Transaction Reference Number and PhilSys Card Number by RA Jen Jen Gano. In addition, the registration team catered to both new registrants and those with registration concerns. Unfortunately, the schedule was interrupted on the second day up to the last day due to typhoon Dante and Emong, and it was planned to reschedule for the following month.

HOW TO GENERATE YOUR DIGITAL NATIONAL ID

- 1 Open your internet browser and type in the website <https://national-id.gov.ph>
- 2 Click the "Proceed" button to provide "Consent" to PSA to use your demographic information and facial image to authenticate.
- 3 In the designated fields, type your **First Name, Middle Name, Last Name, and your Date of Birth.**
- 4 Scroll down and click the "Continue" button.
- 5 Click on the "Start Liveness" button to begin the facial authentication.
- 6 Once verified, you can now proceed to view your Digital National ID by clicking on the "View National ID" button.
- 7 Click on the "Download Digital ID" button to obtain a personal copy of your Digital National ID.
