### PSA Kalinga Brings National ID Registration Closer to Vulnerable Sectors in Tabuk City



Registration Officer II Santiago B. Lucob assisted clients with National ID System house-to-house registration within Tabuk City on July 23, 2025.

In line to its commitment to provide accessible inclusive public service, the Statistics Authority (PSA) Kalinga Statistical Office carried out a house-to-house National registration for the Identification Persons With System targeting Disabilities (PWDs), bedridden individuals, citizens in Tabuk City.

The activity was spearheaded by Registration Officer II (ROII) Santiago B. Lucob and Information Systems Analyst I (ISAI) Ian Decart N. Guidangen, who personally visited the homes of qualified individuals to facilitate their National ID registration. This initiative aims to ensure that members of the community with limited mobility are not left behind in availing themselves of the benefits of National ID.

National The ID System, the serves as government's central identification platform, simplify transactions, designed to improve delivery, and promote inclusion. However, some citizens—particularly PWDs, the elderly, and those confined to their homes—face challenges in physically accessing registration centers.

Through this house-to-house registration, PSA Kalinga addresses these barriers by literally bringing the service to the doorsteps of those who need it most. This approach not only saves registrants time and effort but also reflects PSA's compassion and proactive stance in reaching out to underserved sectors.

### Kalinga's Population Reaches 235,391 in July 1, 2024

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) officially announced that the population of Kalinga has reached 235,391 as of July 1, 2024, based on the results of the 2024 Census of Population (POPCEN). The count was declared official through Proclamation No. 973, signed on July 11, 2025.

The latest figure reflects an increase of 5,821 persons from the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (CPH) count of 229,570, and 22,711 persons more than the 2015 population of 212,680. This translates to an annual population growth rate (PGR) of 0.60 percent from 2020 to 2024—slower than the 1.62 percent recorded between 2015 and 2020.

Among the eight (8) city/municipalities in Kalinga, the City of Tabuk remained most populous with residents, accounting for 52.16 percent of the province's total population. It was 35,033 followed by Pinukpuk residents Rizal with 20.491. and the Lubuagan registered smallest population at 8,660.

From 2020 to 2024, Tanudan posted the fastest PGR at 5.89 percent, recovering from a decline recorded in the previous census period. This was followed by Rizal (1.13 percent), Pinukpuk (0.53 percent), and Tabuk City (0.34 percent). In contrast, Lubuagan recorded the lowest PGR at -1.75 percent, with its population decreasing by 663 persons from 2020 to 2024.

At the barangay level, Bulanao in Tabuk City remained the most populous with 21,219 residents, followed by Bulanao Norte (6,168), Agbannawag (6,047), Magsaysay (5,036), and Dagupan Weste (4,933). Notably, all of the top 10 most populous barangays in Kalinga are located in Tabuk City.


On the other end of the scale, Barangay Old Tinglayan in the municipality of Tinglayan had the smallest population with 287 residents, followed by Anggacan Sur (309), Ngibat (326), Anggacan (335), and Lower Mangali (354).

The 2024 POPCEN was conducted pursuant to the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 (Republic Act No. 10625), Executive Order No. 352, and Batas Pambansa Blg. 72. PSA emphasized that census results provide vital data for planning, policy-making, and decisionfor both government making private sectors, particularly in areas such resource allocation. infrastructure development, and social services delivery.
