## PSA - IFUGAO BRINGS NATIONAL ID REGISTRATION TO THE DOORSTEPS OF HOMEBOUND SENIOR CITIZENS

In a strong demonstration of inclusive public service, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) - Ifugao has intensified its efforts to bring the National ID registration closer to vulnerable groups, particularly senior citizens and persons with limited mobility.

To ensure the effective implementation of this outreach, PSA - Ifugao, in partnership with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), hired additional personnel including two Registration Kit Operators (RKOs), one Registration Assistant (RA), and two Field Validators. These new hires underwent rigorous orientation and training on May 16, 2025 to prepare them for their roles in the National ID registration process.



The sessions equipped them with the necessary knowledge on National ID registration protocols, data privacy regulations, and best practices in handling sensitive interactions especially with the elderly and other vulnerable populations. Following their training, the personnel were assigned to various areas across the province, including Asipulo, Hingyon, and Banaue, to carry out registration activities.

Recognizing opportunities to maximize accessibility, PSA - Ifugao brought registration services directly to the community during key activities. These included the payout of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) during Family Development Sessions (FDS), and the distribution of social pensions to senior citizens under the Social Pension (SOCPEN) program. These targeted interventions helped ensure that beneficiaries could conveniently access National ID registration alongside government support services.

Going beyond routine service delivery, PSA - Ifugao also conducted house-to-house registration for selected senior citizens who were unable to travel to designated sites due to health or mobility issues. Among those prioritized were bedridden elderly individuals, who were registered right in the comfort of their homes highlighting the agency's compassionate approach and commitment to the principle of leaving no one behind.

This initiative reflects PSA - Ifugao's continued dedication to delivering people-centered, accessible, and efficient services in line with Republic Act No. 11055, also known as the Philippine Identification System Act. As the province continues to roll out the national ID registration, the agency affirms its mission to reach even the most underserved members of the community.

#### **SURVEYING FOR PROGRESS:** ASPBI/SICT 2024 IN ALFONSO LISTA

On 05 May 2025, PSA-Ifugao conducted the field survey for the Annual Survey of Philippine Business and Industry (ASPBI) and the 2024 Survey on Information and Communication Technology (SICT) in Alfonso Lista. The survey, conducted by hired statistical researcher Noreen B. Dumaya, runs from 12 April to 31 July 2025.

The ASPBI gathers data on business characteristics, employment, revenue, expenses, and inventories, serving as a key tool for measuring economic growth. Alongside this, the SICT collects information on ICT use such as computer access, internet connectivity, and digital platform adoption to support the country's digital transformation.





#### LFS IN FOCUS: MAY AND JUNE TRAININGS EQUIP STAFF FOR FIELD **SUCCESS**

PSA - Ifugao has conducted the 3rd Level Training for the May and June 2025 Labor Force Survey (LFS) in May. For the May round, the training was held from 5 to 7 May 2025, and was conducted by AS Beverly M. Deleon together with three Statistical Researchers (SRs) who had been hired on a contractual basis. Enumeration was conducted from 8 to 28 May 2025.





For the June LFS, the training was conducted on 27 to 28 May 2025 by SSS Jocelyn O. Tayaban, together with two hired Statistical Researchers. Enumeration is scheduled from 9 to 19 June 2025.





All these Statistical Researchers are from Ifugao, and are tasked to gather critical socio-economic as well as demographic information from the households in the province.

#### **EMPOWERING IFUGAO: KEY INFRASTRUCTURE MILESTONES** SUPPORTED BY PSA - IFUGAO

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) - Ifugao joined the Provincial Local Government Unit (PLGU) in two major events celebrating the blessing and inauguration of key infrastructure projects aimed at improving public service, economic activity, and cultural preservation in the province.

On May 2, 2025, a blessing and Holy Mass led by Father Charlemagne Buyayo were held at the Ifugao Provincial Capitol Compound to inaugurate the newly completed Multipurpose Building, envisioned to serve as a central venue for government operations, public programs, and inter-agency coordination.

A larger event followed on May 5, 2025, at Cadel, Pob. South, Lagawe, where the Access Bridge, Vehicular and Food Terminal, Access Road, Museum, and Food Processing and Trading Post were officially inaugurated. During the same program, the groundbreaking ceremony for the Water System was also conducted as part of the blessing rites, ahead of the Holy Mass celebrated by Bishop Valentin Dimoc. The sequence reflected both a practical and spiritual dedication of these projects to community progress and shared development.

PSA - Ifugao's active participation in these events reflects its continued support for local development efforts and its commitment to serving the public not only through data collection but also through strong interagency collaboration. The agency remains a proud partner in initiatives that uplift communities and contribute to a more inclusive and wellconnected Ifugao.
