PSA-CRASD CONDUCTS PHILSYS BIRTH REGISTRATION ASSISTANCE PROJECT

Regional Director Villafe P. Alibuyog spearheaded the Batch 1 and 2 Philsys Birth Registration Assistance Project Training held at Prince Plaza Hotel, Baguio City on April 11-12, 2022 and April 26-27, 2022, respectively. The objective of this training is to provide the newly hired Birth Registration Agents with a solid understanding on the filling up of the certificate of live birth and to keep them updated on related issues concerning late registration. In addition a refresher course for selected local civil registry staffs will be done concurrently to update their knowledge in filling up civil registry forms. This is also to ensure the registration of delayed birth registrants in the Cordillera Administrative Region. Under the goal of universal registration, at least 99.5 percent of all Filipinos



should have their birth registered with the local authorities and will be provided with the legal documentation through the issuance of the birth certificate. This is also to strengthen the documentation of Step 2 registration of Republic Act No. 11055 otherwise known as the “Philippine Identification System Act” by increasing the use of the birth certificate as the basic document to be presented by citizens seeking to register with PhilSys. Those people in the marginalized communities, indigenous people, muslim Filipinos, poorest sector, and the persons currently living outside their place of birth are the priority individuals for registration. Since this project is in collaboration with the LGUs thru the Local Civil Registry Offices, Chief Statistical Specialists, BRAP focal points, City/Municipal Civil Registrars and their personnel from the provinces were among the attendees. Speakers for this activity were Chief Administrative Officer Adrian A. Cerezo, Registration Officer IV Gerard A. Tolito from the Regional Office Civil Registration and Administrative Support Division (CRASD) and representatives from the Central Office.

PSA CAR Continues to Educate Civil Registration Implementers

The PSA CAR continues to improve the solemnizing officers’ understanding on civil registration. To keep them informed on the newest guidelines, trainings and information dissemination are conducted.

The South-Central Cordillera District Council (SCCDC) invited the PSA for a training for their Solemnizing Officers which was held at Tuding Assembly of God, Inc. on June 2, 2022.

The purpose of this training is to impart the importance of civil registration as well as the duties and tasks of the solemnizing officers as an instrument to promote marriage and family values. They were also trained and updated on the recent procedures regarding the requirements on the application of Certificate of Registration of Authority to Solemnize Marriage (CRASM), filling out Marriage Forms, and briefing of the Marriage Laws.

Inter-Agency Committee on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Meeting for the 2nd Quarter

On May 18, 2022, the RSSO CAR CRASD hosted the second quarter Inter-Agency Committee on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Meeting at the Holiday Inn Baguio City. The meeting was personally attended by the member-agencies except for DFA representative who attended the meeting online.

During the meeting, a number of topics were discussed, including the Instructions in the Accomplishments of Civil Registry Forms (Geographical Identification and Place of Vital Event), MC No. 2021-24 which is the Guidelines in the Registration of Certificate of Live Birth of Persons with No Known Parents or formerly known as the Certificate of Foundling, and PhilSys ID update.

Moreover, Nurse II of the Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit Rejean M. Ayengan of the Department of Health (DOH) - CAR gave an update on COVID-19. There were 118,153 confirmed cases as of May 17, 2022, with 10 active case. The city of Baguio has the most active cases with five, followed by Benguet which has four. Benguet and Ifugao has the lowest vaccination rate. She then requested assistance from the member-agencies to help in the dissemination. As a response, the PSA requested for flyers or brochures to be distributed to the provinces as one way in helping the agency in the information education campaign regarding the importance of vaccination. It was also recommended that a resolution be drafted urging all IACCRVS members and stakeholders to promote the advocacy of vaccination, particularly in the provinces of Benguet and Ifugao.

Training-Workshop on the Criteria and Standardization of OPCR/IPCR Rating and Evaluation and Quality Objectives

The Philippine Statistics Authority Cordillera Civil Registration and Administrative Division organized a two days training-workshop on the criteria and standardization of OPCR/IPCR and evaluation and quality objectives at Holiday Inn, Legarda Rd., Baguio City on June 23-24, 2022. Objectives of this training-workshop are the following: a) to cascade the latest OPCR/IPCR outcome/output rating criteria based on the Strategic Management Plan, b) enumerate, harmonize and standardize the rating criteria from all references, c) participants to be able to understand, cascade and apply the criteria in rating and evaluating the OPCR/IPCR, d) come up with a reference document consolidating the rating criteria to ensure knowledge transfer, easy access, and application, e) introduce the concept of quality objectives to non-QMS-ISO provinces to enjoin compliance with the requirements of ISO 9001:2015, f) establish quality objectives for non-QMS-ISO provinces, and g) align quality objectives with the quality policy and office performance commitment and review of the field offices.

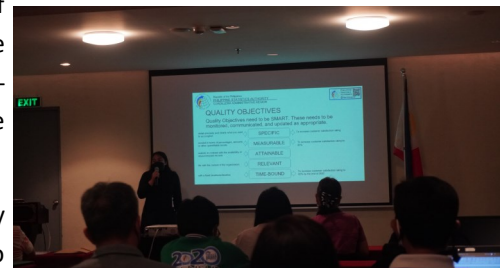
Ada-Gracia M. Balanag, Administrative Aide VI discussed the Quality Objectives. This is a documented requirement of ISO 9001: 2015, a way to spotlight the key elements of the Quality Policy and find a focal point for the efforts of the people in the organization to work towards improvement and ensure customer satisfaction. To accomplish customer satisfaction, an organization needs to formulate a quality policy. The accomplishment of quality policy is monitored through the attainment of several measurable objectives in which one of these is the quality objectives. These objectives will now then be monitored through periodic internal audits. Quality objectives should also be properly communicated throughout the organization so that relevant parties are aware of their involvement and how their job supports meeting the quality objectives.

Chief Statistical Specialist Adrian A. Cerezo spoke on the Bases and Formulation of OPCR/IPCR on the second day of the training. He mentioned that Identifying the Agency's Major Final Outputs/Programs and the Performance Goals of Your Office are two of the Crafting Success Indicators and Formulating Rating Matrices. He stated that performance goals ought to be in line with the Major Final Outputs and that success indicators should be SMART—specific, measurable, attainable, realistic, and time-bound.

During the workshop, participants were divided into three groups. This activity's goal is to create a standard format that can be used by all the provinces and the regional office as well. Additionally, it was also emphasized to align their output with the PRAMIS. Then, each group presented their output for comments.

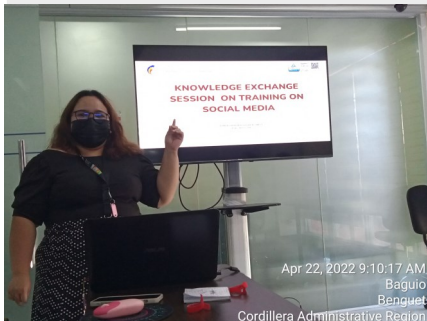

Lecture on Social Media

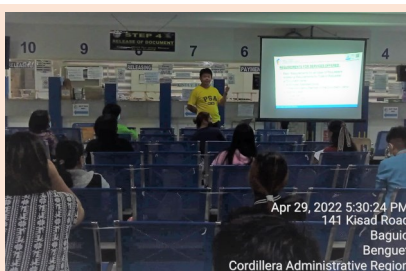

The meeting was conducted to give the associates the knowledge of all its frontline services, including step-by-step procedures showing the requirements, time and fees involved.

Cascade on 5S Good Housekeeping for Quality Workplace Trainers

Admin Aide VI Karen Cera presented the 5S and Productivity. Productivity comes from elimination of waste and it is necessary to attack the root cause of a problem and not just the symptoms. Participation of everyone is needed for the program to be successful. Included in her discussions are the 6S Safety, 7S Security and 8S Satisfaction. Meanwhile, Heaven Leigh Abellera spoke about SEIRI (sort). The main idea behind sorting is to make work simple by eliminating obstacles and prevent accumulation of unnecessary items. Ronald Ryan Milan also discussed the following: a) SEITON (systematize), this is to arrange unnecessary items in good order to prevent accidents. b) SEISO (sweep) - this is to clean your workplace to be safe and easy to work and to prevent machinery and equipment from deterioration. c) SEIKETSU (standardize/sanitize) - is to maintain cleanliness and orderliness and d) SHITSUKE (self-discipline) - to do things spontaneously without being told or ordered. On May 30, 2022, RO IV Gerard A Tolito was the learning provider during the Training-Workshop on the Manual of Instructions on Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act 9255 held at the Function Hall, 3rd Floor Building 2, Municipal Hall Compound, Acop, Caponga, Tublay, Benguet. This training is a continuing activity of the municipality of Tublay which aims to equip the Barangay Civil Registration Agents (BCRA's) who completed their training workshop on Civil Registration. His lecture comprised of four modules which were the following: a) Module 1 Brief Review of the Civil Registration 101 Seminar Workshop, b) Module 2 Introduction of the Manual of Instructions and the Revised IRR of RA 9255, c) Module 3 General Rules and, 4) Accomplishment of the Affidavit to use the surname of the father (AUSF) and sworn attestation. A workshop on modules 2 and 3 was also conducted in between his presentation.

The PSA extends services by providing civil registration matters consultation during the Trabaho Negosyo Kabuhayan (TNK) Business and Job Fairs held at the Saint Louis University, Bishop Carlito Cenzone Sports Center on June 12, 2022 which started at 8:00am. This is a ONE STOP SHOP Job Fair wherein services of the different line agencies were brought near to the jobseekers directly. This was sponsored by the Department of Labor and Employment –Cordillera Administrative Region in partnership with the City Government of Baguio through the Public Employment Service Office. Most of the questions was on the online appointment and the Philsys ID system. They were advised on how to secure a schedule through the online appointment system and they were also informed on how to track the status of the delivery of their ID using the PHLPost Tracker.

The PSA had a regular guesting at Z-Radio 98.7 DWUB FM every Tuesday at 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Objectives of this program is to give updates to the listeners and viewers on PSA's services and to assist or guide them with their civil registry documents concerns. The program was dubbed as "Usapang PSA sa Usapang Legal with Kapitan Peter Omawing Wasing". It is also simulcast live by the Regional News Group—RNG Luzon. It is the leading online platform in North and Central Luzon which provides above industry multi-media production services to all. It can also be viewed in Peter Wasing's Facebook Live.



On April 5, 2022, Registration IV Gerard Tolito gave updates on the process in filing for a petition of typographical error in sex. Based on rule 4.2 of the implementing rules and regulations of Republic Act No. 10172, mandatory requires that in the correction of clerical and typographical error in the entry of sex, the verified petition shall be filed in person with the C/MCR of the city or municipality or the Philippine Consulate, where the record containing the entry discussed on the registration of authority to solemnize of sex in the birth certificate to be corrected is registered. However, in the existing community quarantine and travel restrictions, the

procedural requirement of personal filing for the correction of sex was relaxed and further allow an interim, the filing of migrant petition of correction pending the revision of the IRR. On the other hand, the C/MCR and the Philippine Consulate must ensure strict observance of the other rules and requirements in the processing of gender correction. The listeners expressed certain concerns on their civil registry documents, which RO IV Tolito skillfully handled.

Gerard Tolito, Registration Officer IV was the guest at the Z-Radio on April 19, 2022. He talked about the Philsys Birth Registration Assistance Project. He encourages everyone, particularly those without a certificate of live birth to go to their respective barangays and provide their personal information such as their name, date of birth, place of birth and name of parents. The punong barangay will then send the listed names to the Local Registry Office for confirmation if they really have no record. Following that, LCRO will forward the information to PSA for verification. The names listed will be submitted back to the LCRO for registration once they have been validated by the PSA. He also emphasized that the registration is free of charge. There were several questions regarding the civil registry documents from the audience, which Gerard Tolito answered appropriately.



Registration Officer II Guillermo Bermillo guested at the Z-Radio on April 26, 2022. He provided information about the Philsys Birth Registration Assistance Project. This project is a national initiative spearheaded by the National Statistician and Civil Registrar to ensure that at least 99.5% of all Filipinos have their birth registered with the local authorities. The PSA field offices will be in charge of implementation in collaboration with LGUs thru the Local Civil Registry Offices. Priority individuals for this project are the persons in marginalized communities, indigenous people, muslim Filipinos, poorest sector in the country and those persons currently living outside their place of birth. Another topic which was discussed is the Interim Measure

to Relax the Procedural Requirement of Personal Filing or Appearance for Petition for Correction of Sex under the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 10172. The procedures on the online appointment system was also explained.

On May 31, 2022, Registration Officer II Guillermo B. Bermillo talk about the online appointment. He reminded the listeners that the office is in full implementation on the online appointment and clients who wish to apply for their civil registry documents should have their schedules at the online appointment system. However, the office still has a courtesy lane for the senior citizens, pregnant women and physically challenged people who don't need an appointment, but their requests should only be restricted to their own civil registry documents and their immediate families. RO II Bermillo also spoke about the steps and procedures on the appointment online system. Additionally, he gave an overview of the Birth Registration Assistance Project, he mentioned that the project is in collaboration with the LGUs. Unregistered persons in marginalized communities, indigenous people, muslim Filipinos and the poorest sector in the country are the priority individuals for this project. There were several inquiries which were responded by RO II G. Bermillo.



Registration Officer IV Gerard A. Tolito guested at Z Radio June 21, 2022. He discussed the updates on the ongoing Birth Registration Assistance Project. Some LCROs have already provided a list of names of prospective delayed registrants and their details of birth, which was sent to PSA- Central Office thru the Provincial Statistical Office for verification in the archive and Civil Registry System database for the existence of birth record to avoid double registration. Questions thru text

were also addressed by RO IV Tolito.

PSA RSSO CAR Conducts Ocular Inspection to Church

Various churches were visited for inspection during the 2nd quarter of 2022. The field verification is a process conducted by PSA RSSO CAR in partnership with Provincial Statistical Office Benguet to validate the requirements submitted by the Solemnizing Officer applicants for the issuance of Certificate of Registration of Authority to Solemnize Marriage (CRASM). The requirements to be verified include certifications by a barangay/city/municipality, religious sect and local church address.

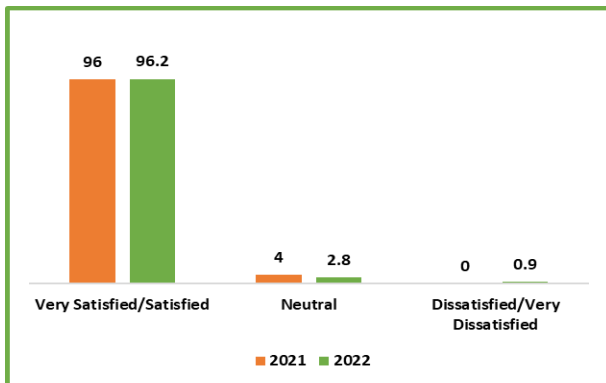


2ND QUARTER 2022 CENSUS SERBILIS CENTER—BAGUIO CITY

SATISFACTION RATING AT 96.2%

There is a high level of satisfaction among clients of the Civil Registry System (CRS)-Baguio City outlet for the second quarter of 2022 measured at 96.2 percent. Out of the 106 respondents, 102 respondents were very satisfied or satisfied, 3 were neither satisfied nor dissatisfied while 1 respondent was dissatisfied with the services provided at the outlet as shown below.

The number of female clients of the outlet in June 2022 grew by 7 percent compared to the same period in 2021. Table 5 shows that 7 out of 10 of the randomly selected clients are females while more than two in every ten respondents are males. This implies that most of the transacting clients at the CRS Serbilis Outlet in Baguio City are represented by female individuals.

Under the educational attainment of clients, data reveals that most of the clients in both survey periods have attended higher educational attainment with 33 in every 50 clients. Meanwhile, about 33 percent and 0.9 percent of respondents had graduated or finished the secondary level and elementary level, respectively.

As to the employment status, the number of employed has an increase of 5 percent in June 2022 as compared to the same period last year. The table below shows that majority of the

SOLEMNIZING OFFICERS INFORMATION SYSTEM (SOIS)

Solemnizing Officers Information System (SOIS) is a primary software tool used by the office of the Civil Registrar General (OCRG) to maintain the repository of solemnizing officers in the Philippines. The CRASM filed by the Solemnizing Officers were processed using this web-based tool, the PSA can add a new applicant, renew previous registrations and assist in validating records of current registrants. It is also a query system that can be used by the public to check the status of the authority of the solemnizing officer.

Solemnizing Officers (SO) are officers vested with the authority to solemnize marriage or officiate the marriage of a man and a woman in accordance with the law or the rites, practices, and ceremonies as prescribed or granted by their religion/religious sect or tribe or ethnic aggrupation.

Table 2 shows that in the three month period, the total number of registered SOs consistently decreased.

The office received a total of 60 new applications of CRASM during the 2nd quarter of 2022, as expected 93.3 percent are males while 6.7 percent are females.

The month of April presents the most number of applicants with 29 applicants, followed by May and June with 16 and 15 applicants respectively.

2ND QUARTER 2022 VITAL STATISTICS IN THE CORDILLERA ADMINISTRATIVE REGION

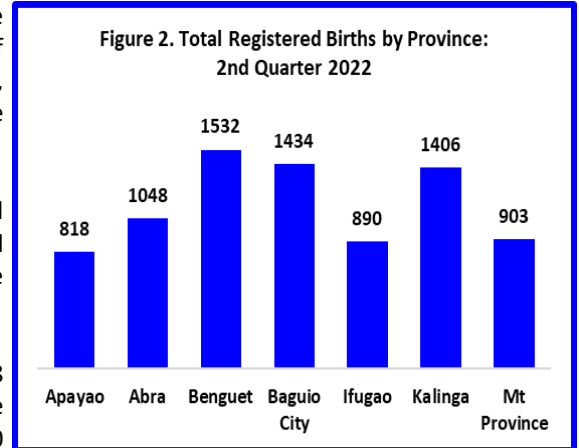
Data for the 2nd Quarter 2022 Vital Statistics were obtained from the Office of the City/Municipal Registrars throughout the region and submitted to the Philippine Statistics Authority - Regional Statistical Services Office Cordillera Administrative Region (PSA-RSSO CAR) through the Decentralized Vital Statistics System (DVSS) 2022 of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)-Provincial Offices (POs) of the Cordillera Region. Information presented included births, deaths and marriages and figures presented herein are still preliminary.

BIRTH STATISTICS

The number of registered live births in the Cordillera Administrative Region for the 2nd quarter of 2022 summed up to 8,031 an increase of 8.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2021. On the average, there were 88 babies born daily or almost 4 babies born per hour in the region.

Among the Provinces, Benguet has the highest occurrence of registered live births with 19 in every 20 births, followed by Kalinga at 1,406 and Abra with 1,048. The province of Apayao had the least registered live births with 818.

A total of 4,207 male babies were registered, contributing 52.38 percent share to the total births in the region, while 3,824 females were recorded in the 2nd quarter of 2022. This resulted in a sex ratio of 110 males per 100 females.

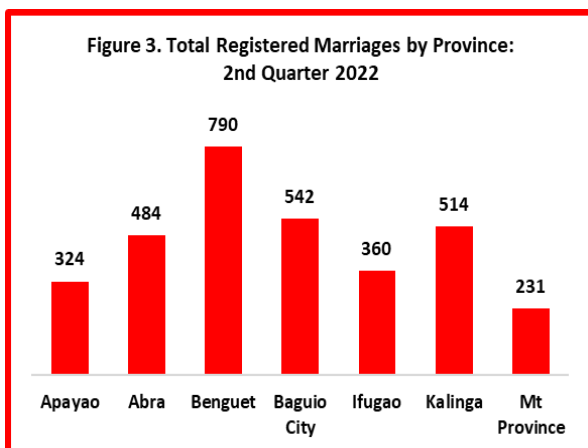


MARRIAGE STATISTICS

There were a total of 3,245 marriages registered for the 2nd quarter of 2022 showing an increase of 40.4 percent from the same quarter of last year's figure of 1,934.

The Province of Benguet excluding Baguio City recorded the highest number of marriages, accounting to 6 out of 25 marriages in the Region. Meanwhile, the least number of marriages was recorded in Mt Province with 231 marriages or 7.1 percent.

On the average, 36 marriages were solemnize daily in the Region or 1 marriage being officiated every hour.

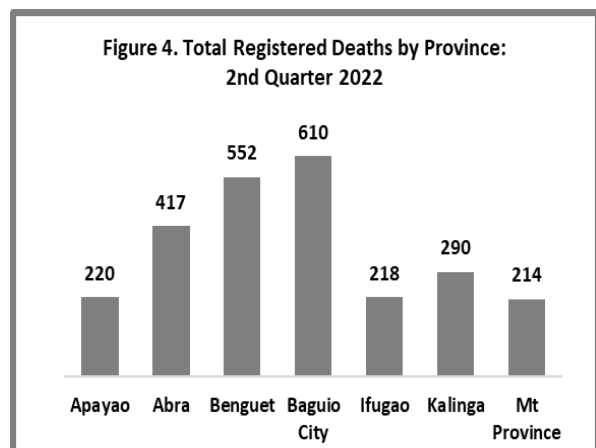


DEATH STATISTICS

During the 2nd quarter of 2022, the number of registered deaths in CAR reach 2,521. The figure shows a decrease of 25.2 percent death incidence from the 2021 of 3,156.

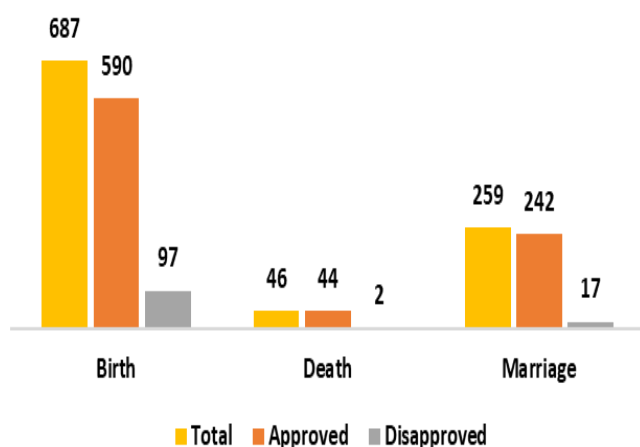
Across areas, Baguio City recorded the most number of registered deaths with a total of 610 or 24.2 percent share of the total recorded deaths in the Region.

On the other hand, Benguet followed among the Provinces in CAR with 552 or 21.9 percent. Abra came next with 417, Kalinga with 29, Apayao with 220, Ifugao with 218 and Mt Province with the least registered deaths with 214.

Electronic Endorsement is a decentralized, and on-line process of forwarding birth, death and marriage certificates that are not found in the Civil Registry System (CRS) database and Archives. These endorsed documents are scanned and sent to the Philippine Statistics Authority's Civil Registry Management Division (CRMD) at the Central Office for approval. Once approved it can be printed out in any CRS outlet after seven days. These documents could be an advance copy or a request for clearer copy of the document owner if he/she wishes to, or if minor by any of the parents.

Figure 2 shows that the highest endorsed documents is on birth with a total of 590 documents, followed by marriage at 242 documents and death at 44 documents.

Out of the 876 endorsed documents, nearly 9 in every 10 were approved while 11.69 percent were disapproved.
